### 1 Background of the seminar

This seminar in Amsterdam will be held as part of an international Atlantis project on Short Cycle Higher Education Programs in the United States and countries involved in the Bologna Process. This process is focused on important aspects of the national higher education areas, crucial for international cooperation between higher education institutions and for the recognition of degree programs. The Short Cycle in the European Higher Education Area can be the first higher degree in a national context, as level 5 in the European Qualifications Framework, and in this way the underlying programs are important for the building of necessary bridges between secondary (vocational) education and tertiary (higher professional and/or academic) education.

One of the biggest challenges in most of the countries is to formulate an effective strategy on Life Long Learning, to get more and better skilled people, also on the Bachelor's and higher levels. The Short Cycle, called Associate degree in The Netherlands, the U.S., Australia et cetera, and the Foundation degree in the U.K., is one of the 'instruments' to get more flexible learning paths, as can be seen in those countries. But there are more instruments, often to be used in combination with Short Cycle Higher Education program, like: Recognition of Prior Learning, cooperation with professional bodies, non-formal education as part of formal programs and so on. In this seminar we will discuss national strategies on LLL, the place of the SCHE in the higher education area and the use of instruments which are also subjects in the Bologna Process.
